MISSION STATEMENT: The Mission of the Ulster Project is to help young, Christian based potential leaders from Northern Ireland and the United States to become peacemakers by providing a safe environment to learn by practicing the skills needed to unite people when differences divide them.

FACTS ABOUT THE ULSTER PROJCET: In 1974, members of the Protestant and Catholic clergy began an effort to bridge the gulf between the factions in Northern Ireland by bringing together in the United States young people from both sides of the conflict. The Ulster Project is an ecumenical peace movement supported by religious leaders in the United States and in Ireland. The simple plan was to provide a place away from the pressures of peers and society, where those teens who might become the future leaders of Northern Ireland could meet and get to know one another. In 1987 Alliance became a host site for the Ulster Project, joining existing programs which now make up 14 projects throughout the United States.

The Northern Irish participants in the Ulster Project are 14-16 years old and are selected by teachers and clergy for their leadership potential. There are an equal number of boys and girls, Protestants and Catholics, and they are paired with American host teens of the same gender, age, and religious affiliation. The four-week program encompasses a planned calendar of social, religious and service activities involving all of the teenagers. The Ulster Project is committed to promoting reconciliation between Northern Irish Catholics and Protestants by fostering tolerance, understanding, acceptance and friendship among the project participants.

The Ulster project has not brought an end to "the troubles" in Northern Ireland, but it has shown that over 800 years of violent history can be set aside. It offers hope that sectarian differences between individual human beings may not be as strong as the bonds of mutual friendship once established, and that the desire to avenge past wrongs may not be as great as the desire for peace and the hope for the future. As Northern Ireland continues to seek the path toward a permanent peace, the Ulster Project works in its own way, "peace by piece" ... one child at a time.
